



'Writing the Story of A Viking in Iona' David Greig Saturday 6th Sept, 2pm. Tickets £4/10. Venue: The Schoolroom

In 2022, in the aftermath of the Covid crisis, celebrated playwright David Greig decided to take a month off and go on a walk. As he meandered among the Roman roads and the old stones of Strathearn, he picked up books about the saints who travelled east from Ireland spreading Christianity. By the time he reached Crieff he realised he was, as if drawn by a magnet, heading for Iona. Over the next weeks a story began to form in his mind. A story about a Viking who finds himself stuck on Iona with a monk and woman who brews mead.



Rooted in the early history of Iona, Columba's Bones is a unique and thrilling read, exploring the clash of early Christianity and paganism, and expanding into a sharp, witty meditation on philosophy, redemption, shame, violence, love, transcendence and reality. Join us to for a captivating insight into the author's process of shaping and writing this story into being.

'Woven in Stems of Ink - Unravelling Secrets & Stories' L.A.MacRae Saturday 6th Sept, 3.30pm. Tickets £3/6. Venue: The Schoolroom



Join Scottish author and musician L.A. MacRae in conversation with Innerpeffray's own Assistant Keeper and singer Naomi Harvey, for live traditional music and an engaging discussion of folklore, writing, and things hidden in books. Joining us remotely from her home in Skye, MacRae will be reading from her debut novel 'And Now The Light Is Everywhere', a sweeping family mystery set in Argyll which was longlisted for the Caledonian Novel Award and described by Joseph O' Connor as 'vivid, involving and beautifully written'. She describes the

process of writing as "following a lot of trails - and then, quite suddenly, themes and images and places start to converge and then you know you're onto something; you know you've hit a seam." Her novel follows the weaving of such themes; of family, testimony, rurality, and memory at the edge of recollection.

'Things Found In Books' music with Yvonne Lyon & Boo Hewerdine Saturday 6th Sept, 7pm. Tickets £15. Venue: The Library

Singer-songwriter duo Yvonne Lyon and Boo Hewerdine's collaboration, 'Things Found In Books', is a performance of songs written in response to a notice board in Culzean Castle's second-hand bookshop. Notes, photographs, old receipts, letters, postcards and fragments of people's lives had been collected and kept on the wall among the bookshelves. Forming an inimitable songwriting



partnership, Yvonne and Boo wove these ephemeral stories with their own, creating a performance full of nostalgia and beauty, hope and longing.

Where better to hear these songs of things found in books than in the unique setting of Innerpeffray Library, surrounded by the historic bookshelves containing their own tales of lives well and variously lived.

Introduction to Book Making with Marion Archibald
